We Provide, Protect, and Preserve Pamilies.

Each year, in locations throughout northern New Jersey, Children's Aid and Family Services is working to support about 12,000 New Jersey children and families. Of these, there are about 100 particularly vulnerable children, many with special needs, ranging in age from infants to teenagers for whom we provide group homes and therapeutic foster care, as well as adoptive families.

Other families from throughout our region turn to us to access a vast array of services that give them real solutions to everyday life challenges. The agency's top-notch child care and early learning center located in Paramus gives more than 200 families peace of mind as their children receive high-quality, curriculum-based child care. More than 40 percent of the children at the center receive the subsidized funds from our agency that are needed for enrollment.


Family Counseling Service of Ridgewood, our busy family life and wellness center, provides traditional support and counseling services to families during times of transition or crisis – and much more. It offers a diverse assortment of workshops and programs that are geared to today's busy families, giving them an appealing outlet in which to strengthen their family relationships. Responsible Management That Puts Pamilies First.

At Children's Aid and Family Services, we're proud to report that most of our budget goes directly to support client programs. With facilities throughout northern New Jersey, a staff of 350 employees, and an annual operating budget of approximately \$18 million, we have a remarkably low administrative overhead. We are fiscally responsible, but never at the cost of program quality. In fact, for the last 10 years our agency has been accredited by The Council on Accreditation, one of the nation's leading accreditation authorities. We are also considered an industry leader in the area of continuous quality improvement and have been a trusted partner with dozens of community, government, corporate, volunteer, and other nonprofit organizations that join us to achieve our mission.

Pamilies Plan Ahead. So Should We.

Children's Aid and Family Services has an outstanding record of planning for its future. During our history, we have completed two successful capital expansion campaigns, which have ensured our financial stability, particularly through building acquisitions. We also operate a number of named endowments valued at about \$1.7 million. These endowments are expertly managed by a specially appointed committee of investment professionals that reports regularly to the agency's Board of Trustees. Thanks to skilled and prudent management by this committee, the agency's endowment funds have steadily grown.

Pamilies Are Forever. Their Needs Will Continue.

Families never go away and nor do their challenges. That is why our Board of Trustees and volunteer leadership have launched the **Next Century of Excellence** campaign. This campaign will enhance our ability to help families meet their challenges, as well as provide the financial security necessary for us to continue to deliver services in the future. The goal of the campaign is to raise \$3 million by the end of 2007.

Of the \$3 million, \$2 million will be used to expand our outstanding child care center and flagship building at 200 Robin Road, Paramus. Specifically, we plan to:

- **1.** Add more classrooms to provide educational opportunities to more children.
- **2.** Add a state-of-the-art training center to expand our leadership role as a regional training ground for early childhood education, and consolidate key program support personnel at one location.
- **3.** The remaining \$1 million will be used to grow the agency's Anne Goheen Crane Endowment Fund. This endowment fund ensures financial stability for the agency now and in the future.
